Speaker: Prof. Katja Poppenhaeger

Title: Magnetic activity as the landscaping force in stellar and exoplanetary systems *Abstract:* The spectrum of magnetic activity phenomena - such as spots, flares, coronal emission, and winds - can be observed for our Sun in great detail, while the corresponding observations of stars trade off spatial resolution for a much larger parameter space. There has been a lot of progress as well as new puzzling insights into several areas of magnetic activity and the way it interacts with the stellar surroundings lately. I will give an overview of the wide range of possible connections between solar/stellar magnetism, space weather and exoplanets. Then I will discuss some recent or in-progress highlights in the areas of stellar spin-down, starspot locations on the stellar surface, stellar magnetism in connection to star-planet interactions, and coronal emission line physics and its impact on exoplanet atmospheres.
